

CAMPAIGN FUND CHAIRMAN

HAYS, KS.--Hays civic and business leader, Norbert Dreiling, has accepted the role of Campaign Fund Chairman in the Fort Hays State University-Sheridan Coliseum \$2,000,000 fund raising program.

The announcement was made today by Campaign Council Chairman, Robert Schmidt. Schmidt said, "If we are fortunate enough to continue attracting top leaders like Norbert Dreiling to the campaign, we will certainly be successful in reaching our goal."

Dreiling said, "I am honored to have been asked to get involved in this project. Since its opening in 1917, Sheridan Coliseum has added abundantly either directly or indirectly to anyone who has ever lived in Western Kansas."

"Through this once excellent facility, we have been exposed to any number of outstanding cultural, athletic, and agricultural events," said Dreiling. "Many of these events would never have come to Western Kansas had it not been for Sheridan Coliseum. Sadly, THAT Sheridan Coliseum no longer exists. The proposed renovation project will transform the coliseum into a 1,200-seat performing arts center...once again breathing life into this historic building."

Dreiling is a prominent local attorney. He has been very active in state and local politics. He and his wife, Jeannie, have four children.
