
REF: Rarick Souvenirs

Sometime ago we visited about Rarick Hall as a means of involving alumni and raising funds for the university. The conclusions that I can present now remain vague in details but will give you something to go on at this time.

1. Photographs:
An individual signed photograph (by Professor Zoran Stevanov) for \$10.00 each - minimum order of twenty.
2. Photographic Reproduction:
Original photograph sold for \$100.00 and turned over to Bob Mai for duplication and sold at your designated price. Work would not be signed. Size could vary but would affect the selling price.
3. 3. Cut stone from building:
Stone cut approximately 3" x 5", unfinished with a sticker seal attached to top. Seal could be the university seal. Cost is difficult to determine since there is no one available for stone cutting.
4. Original Photoserigraph:
A signed original, limited edition of a 11" x 14" silk screen print of Rarick Hall. Genen Wineland (M.A. 1975) will do an addition of fifty or less at \$5.00 each. Three colors, ready for framing. You establish the selling price.
