MINUTES OF A FACULTY MEETING

Hays, Kansas
June 11, 1934

Those absent were: Miss Barbour; Miss Felten; Miss Heidman; Mr. Malloy; Miss Millett; Mr. Riley; Miss Vandiver; Mr. Wooster; Dr. W. H. Walker; and Mr. Yeager.

Mr. Rarick made some announcements regarding the enrollment and Short Course and faculty schedule and size of classes. He also told of the emergency which we were facing in connection with the request of the government to establish a ~~Transient~~ Camp and a Drought Relief Camp, and the need of young men in this territory who wish to attend college.

Mr. Lee made motion that a committee of three members of the faculty be appointed to cooperate with the Executive Committee of the Faculty Men's Group in working out a schedule of events as they come to the Faculty Men's Group and to the faculty as a whole, especially evening dinner engagements. Seconded by Dr. Morris, and carried.

Dr. Rarick appointed Mr. Start, Miss Agnew, and Miss Gorham to serve as this committee.

Dr. McGrath made a statement regarding the visit of Alonzo F. Meyers on the 12th of June, and the program set up for him on that date.

Some discussion was had regarding the matter of late enrollment. This matter was referred to the Standard and Credit Relation Committee for action.
