Faculty meeting, Sept. 10, 1934

Meeting was held in the Library, the following persons were absent; Miss Davis, Miss Dresher, Miss Felten, Mrs. Golden, Miss Gorham, Miss Haggart, Miss Heidman, Dr. McGrath, Miss McCarnoll, Miss Paul, Dr. Reed, Mr. Rouse, Dr. Moreland, Mr. Thompson, Dr. Wiest and Mr. Yeager. The faculty members engaged in giving freshman tests, and in the Training School were excused.

Dr. Rarick made some announcements regarding the opening of the school year, fire hazards on the campus, the accounting for funds by various departments or individuals, the preparation of the biennial report, office appointments, committee assignments and student employment. He asked that insofar as possible ~~the~~ Wednesday evenings be kept free from activities because of the church program.

Mr. Albertson made an announcement about labor assignments and the work program for the students, and the report of unsatisfactory service.

Dean Lee made some announcements concerning the Freshman Week activities.

Dr. Warnock commented on the difference in the statement in the fall schedule of classes, ~~that~~ page 10, that all Freshmen were required to enroll in the three survey courses unless exempted by Freshmen tests and the statement on page 38 of the general catalogue regarding requirements in the lower division. This matter was referred to the steering committee for immediate consideration, before freshman enrollment.

The question was raised as to why the offerings in the Humanities Course was not confined to the humanities group. This question was not answered.
