This report was discussed. Dr. Garwood said that the Probation List was received from IBM Saturday morning after the close of the semester. At a previous time it was suggested that if we could get this information on Saturday that it might be sufficient time to notify students who would be suspended. It would not have been possible to do that this past semester. It was asked how many of those students who would have been suspended after two semesters of unsatisfactory work were enrolled. This information will be presented at the next meeting. Another suggestion was that it might be worthwhile to get the information as to whether there are some courses which are being failed by many of these students.

Sometime ago Dr. Tomasek received a letter from St. Francis Hospital in Wichita asking about an affiliation with Fort Hays Kansas State College for the granting of the Medical Technician certificate.

Dr. Schroder explained that this is the same kind of affiliation that we have with Lattimore-Fink in Topeka. He visited the St. Francis Hospital and found that their facilities are excellent. It is a large hospital with over one million procedures a year. At present there are two Fort Hays students who are at St. Francis. In the past it has been necessary to approve each case and so it would be helpful if this affiliation could be approved as it would not be necessary to approve each case individually. These students enroll at Fort Hays for three years of study and then spend one year in a hospital laboratory and this is transferred to Fort Hays for thirty hours of work to complete the degree. It was explained that these are laboratory technicians. This does not require college work but these people are not medical technicians.

The affiliation at K.U. was discussed. Mr. Schroder said that although K.U. had invited us to affiliate with them, after we had accepted their invitation, they told us that we lacked one particular course to qualify. This course is being placed in our curriculum and we presume that an affiliation will then be acceptable. The advantage of having the affiliation in the catalog is that each case does not have to be brought before the Faculty Senate Executive Committee for action.

RECOMMENDATION: It was recommended that we affiliate with St. Francis Hospital in Wichita for the Medical Technician as explained above. Seconded.

It was suggested that it might be better to investigate this further.

RECOMMENDATION: It was recommended that we table the above motion until next meeting when more information would be available. Seconded and carried.

Enrollment Procedure: The enrollment procedure was discussed and the following suggestions were made:

Set up the enrollment so that seniors could be given the advantage of enrolling before the others.

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Division Chairman have said that they would provide for any senior who "has to have" a course.

They have also said that they would do this for juniors.

Some of these problems arise because students have failed courses or have not arranged the programs properly, or have changed majors, etc. It was suggested that not all these problems are due to the enrollment procedure.

The information about classes being closed does not reach the advisers fast enough.

Students change their programs too frequently and for some very trivial reasons. It was suggested that a fee might be charged for changing programs.

Pre-enrollment for all students was discussed. This would be very helpful regarding the number of sections, etc., needed. It was suggested that it takes a great amount of the advisers' time.

Advanced Placement. We have not had many requests for Advanced Placement but it is very likely that we will be having more and more. It was noted that the three state colleges in Kansas have not been authorized by the Board of Regents for this.

The meeting adjourned at 4:45 p.m.
