Minutes of the meeting of the Faculty Senate, Monday, May 3, 1965, at 3:30 p.m.
in the Office of the Dean of the Faculty.

The meeting was called to order by the chairman, Dr. Garwood.

Mr. Dalton displayed a chart which he prepared regarding the Applications
for Admission in previous years and up to this time. The figures indicate a
sharp increase of those seeking admission for the school year of 1965-66. The
figures are running about 50% greater than for the school year of 1964-65.

Style Manual. At the last meeting the request from the committee for
the adoption of style manuals was presented. The recommendation to approve
the adoption of the two Manuals was tabled.

RECOMMENDATION: It was moved to take the question from the table. Seconded.
Carried.

The Recommendation made and seconded at the last meeting was presented. This
motion was that the two Style Manuals by Kate L. Turabian be adopted. The
motion carried.

It was asked if there is a relationship between those in disciplinary
trouble and being on academic probation. It was suggested that it might be
well to tighten the rules. The good students should be motivated to do even
better work. The committee studying probation will report this summer. A
study will be made following the Spring semester of people who are academi-
cally suspended.

The procedure was explained regarding the removal of a U grade. Dropping
classes was discussed. It was suggested that students should not be permitted
to withdraw from a course near the end of the semester. If a student has
stayed in the class for most of the semester, he should not be given permission
to withdraw at the "eleventh hour." This was discussed.

Dr. Garwood said that the plans for Commencement were being made. If
there are any suggestions to improve the Commencement activities, they should
be made now.
