Discussion: ENROLLMENT INFORMATION. (For advisors for 2nd semester.)

Minutes of the meeting of the Faculty Senate, Tuesday, January 7, 1969, at 3:30 p.m., in the Office of the Dean of the Faculty.

Members Present: Mr. Ginther, Mr. Schroder, Dr. Thomas, Mrs. Popp, Miss Christopher, Dr. Miller, Mrs. Theis, Dr. Witten, Dr. Oliva, Mr. Dalton, Mr. Finnin and Dr. Garwood, Chairman.

Members Absent: Dr. Hamilton and Dr. Sackett.

Also Present: Mr. Kellerman.

The meeting was called to order by Dr. Garwood, Chairman.

SALE OF BOOKS. Mr. John Stoss, who graduated from Fort Hays in 1962 with a major in Speech, has indicated that he will be establishing a market for second-hand books. He has requested the Office of the Dean of the Faculty to provide him with a list of books which will be used for the second semester. Mr. Stoss said that he expects to receive used books from students, establish a price on them and sell the books to prospective users for the current semester. In view of the fact that the College has no commitment to any given bookstore, the Office of the Dean of the Faculty is supplying him with a list of the books to be used for the second semester.

CLASS SCHEDULE FOR THE SECOND SEMESTER. A Schedule of Classes for the spring semester is being printed and a copy will be mailed to all faculty members by January 10.

CATALOG. The College Catalog will be taken to the State Printer at Topeka January 15.

SUSPENSION REPORTS. Suspension lists will be distributed to all advisors prior to enrollment for the second semester. The grade report of every suspended student will carry this information on it. Thus, a student will be informed of

his suspension initially through the media of the grade report and secondly, his advisor will also have this information. Within a very short time, each suspended student will receive a notification by mail that he is suspended.

MEETING OF SENATE REPRESENTATIVES OF THE SIX STATE SCHOOLS. Dr. Witten represented Fort Hays Kansas State College at a meeting of the Senate representatives of the six state schools. This is the first meeting of Senate representatives. A copy of Dr. Witten's report is attached to the Minutes.

Dr. Witten discussed with the Senate members the meeting at Emporia.

RECOMMENDATION: Dr. Witten moved that the Senate approve the resolution adopted by the Council of State University and College Senates. The resolution reads as follows:

"The Council of State University and College Senates vigorously protests the arbitrary actions of the state department of administration in the recent decisions to establish a state wide health insurance program, and to change the pay date of state classified and unclassified personnel. The council deplors the lack of prior consultation with appropriate representatives of the faculty and administrations of the state colleges and universities. In view of the inconveniences and problems arising because of the unique situation of the great majority of college and universities faculty, who are traditionally employed and paid on a nine month basis, these decisions should be re-examined. The council would welcome the opportunity to discuss these urgent matters with the appropriate state officials at the earliest possible date, or to join with the council of presidents in so doing."

The motion was seconded by Dr. Oliva.

Questions were raised by the Senate members as to the meaning of the resolution. Dr. Witten said that the Council objected to the manner in which the the health plan was adopted and the pay date changed. The chief objection was that the individuals affected were not consulted before the action was taken.

The question was called for. Motion carried.

ENROLLMENT INFORMATION. The information which advisors will receive for the second semester enrollment was distributed to the Senate members. A meeting of Division Chairmen is scheduled for January 13 and the process of advising will

will be discussed at this meeting. It was suggested that information dealing with Pass/Fail be provided along with the information at hand. During the fall semester, 19 students enrolled in the Pass/Fail program.

All advisors will receive cards which they will utilize when a student enrolls in a course for Pass/Fail credit.

The meeting adjourned at 4:30 p.m.
